





First Steps

Step 1 Attach the Camera Strap








Step 2 Insert the Battery and Memory Card

If a memory card is inserted, images will be saved on the memory card when you take images. If a memory card is not inserted, images will be saved in the camera's internal memory.


2.1 Open the battery-chamber/memory card slot cover.



2.2 Insert the battery.

- Push the orange battery latch in the direction indicated by the arrow (1), and fully insert the battery (2).
- The battery locks into place when inserted correctly.

Be Careful to Insert the Battery in Correct Direction

Inserting the battery upside down or backwards could damage the camera.



2.3 Insert the memory card.

• Slide the memory card in until it clicks into place.

Memory card slot




Be Careful to Insert the Memory Card in Correct Direction

Inserting the memory card upside down or backwards could damage the camera and the memory card.





2.4 Close the battery-chamber/memory card slot cover.




Removing the Battery and Memory Card

Turn the camera off and make sure that the power-on lamp and the monitor have turned off, and then open the battery-chamber/memory card slot cover.

 The camera, battery, and memory card may be hot immediately after using the camera.

Removing the Battery

 Move the battery latch in the direction indicated by the arrow (1) to eject the battery (2).



Removing the Memory Card

• Gently push the memory card into the camera (1) to partially eject the card (2).



Step 3 Charge the Battery

Use the included charging AC adapter and USB cable to charge the battery while it is in the camera.

3.1 Prepare the included charging AC adapter.

If a plug adapter* is included with your camera, attach the plug adapter to the plug on the charging AC adapter. Push the plug adapter firmly until it is securely held in place. Once the two are connected, attempting to forcibly remove the plug adapter could damage the product.








- Keep the camera turned off.
- Make sure that the plugs are properly oriented. Do not insert or remove the plugs at an angle when connecting or disconnecting them.

Notes

Do not use a USB cable other than the UC-E21. Using a USB cable other than the UC-E21 could result in overheating, fire or electric shock.




- The charge lamp slowly flashes green to indicate that the battery is charging.
- About 2 hours and 20 minutes are required to charge a fully exhausted battery.
- **3.3** Disconnect the charging AC adapter from the electrical outlet and then disconnect the USB cable.

Step 4 Turn On the Camera

Press the power switch.

- The monitor turns on.
- Note that the power switch is enabled a few seconds after the battery is inserted. Wait a few seconds before pressing the power switch



The Auto Off Function

If no operations are performed for a while, the monitor will turn off, the camera will enter standby mode, and the power-on lamp will flash. If no operations are performed for another 3 minutes, the camera will turn off automatically.

Step 5 Select a Language and Set the Camera Clock

When the camera is turned on for the first time, the languageselection screen and the date and time setting screen for the camera clock are displayed. Use the multi selector to make the settings.

- If you exit without setting the date and time, will flash when the shooting screen is displayed.
- **5.1** Use the multi selector ▲▼ to select the desired language and press the button.





5.2 Select **Yes** and press the **®** button.



5.3 Select your home time zone and press the button

Daylight Saving Time

If daylight saving time is in effect, press ▲ to enable the daylight saving time function.

- When the daylight saving time function is enabled, is displayed above the map.
- Press ▼ to disable the daylight saving time function.



- - Select a field: Press ◀► (changes between D, M, Y, h, and m).
 - Edit the date and time: Press AV.
 Date and time can also be changed by rotating the multi selector.
 - Confirm the setting: Select the **m** field and press the **®** button.



5.6 Select **Yes** and press the **®** button.

 When settings are finished, the lens extends and the camera switches to shooting mode.



Imprinting the Date and Time on Images While Taking Images

After setting the date and time, enable the **Print date** option in the \P (setup) menu (\square 24).

Display the \P (setup) menu using the following procedure and change the settings.

Press the **MENU** button \rightarrow press the multi selector \blacktriangleleft \rightarrow use \blacktriangle \blacktriangledown to select the \P (setup) menu icon and press the \P button \rightarrow use \blacktriangle \blacktriangledown to select an item and press the \P button.

Changing the Language Setting and the Date and Time Setting

Just as described under "Imprinting the Date and Time on Images While Taking Images" above, display the \P (setup) menu (\square 24) and set **Language** or **Time zone and date**.



Shooting and Playback

Step 1 Rotate the Mode Dial and Align the (Auto) Icon to the Mark



Step 2 Check the Battery Level and the Number of Exposures Remaining

Number of Exposures Remaining

is displayed when no memory card is inserted in the camera, and images are saved in the internal memory.

Step 3 Hold the Camera and Frame a Picture

- **3.1** Hold the camera steady in both hands.
 - Keep fingers and other objects away from the lens, flash, AF-assist illuminator, microphones, and speaker.
- **3.2** Frame the picture.




Using the Zoom

Move the zoom control.

- To zoom in closer to the subject, move the zoom control toward **T** (telephoto).
- To zoom out and view a larger area, move the zoom control toward W (wide-angle).
 When you turn the camera on, the zoom moves to the maximum wide-angle position.

Zoom out Zoom in




Step 4 Focus and Shoot

- **4.1** Press the shutter-release button halfway, i.e., press the button lightly until you feel a slight resistance.
 - When the subject is in focus, the focus area that includes the subject or focus indicator glows green (multiple focus areas can glow green).



 The camera focuses on one of them





When no human faces are detected:

- If the main subject is detected, the camera focuses on it.
- If no main subject is detected, the camera automatically selects one or more of the 9 focus areas containing the subject closest to the camera.

Raising and Lowering the Flash

• If the subject is dimly lit, the flash will pop up automatically when you press the shutter-release button halfway when the flash mode is set to \$\alpha\limbda{110} (auto; default setting). The flash will fire when you press the shutter-release button all the way.



 Lower the flash by gently pushing it down. When not taking images, lower the flash.

Flash lamp

The flash lamp indicates flash status when the shutter-release button is pressed halfway.



On	The flash fires when an image is taken.	
Flashing	The flash is charging.*	
Off	The flash does not fire when an image is taken.	

^{*} If the battery level is low, the monitor turns off while the flash is charging.

4.2 Without lifting your finger, press the shutter-release button the rest of the way down to take the picture.



- The shutter is released and the image is saved.
- If you press the shutter-release button with too much force, the camera may shake, causing images to be blurred. Press the button gently.

Step 5 Play Back Images

Press the (playback) button. The camera enters playback mode.

- The last image captured is displayed in full-frame playback mode.
- Use the multi selector ▲▼◀▶ to display previous or next images.
- Images can also be selected by rotating the multi selector.
- To return to shooting mode, press the button or shutter-release button.



Step 6 Delete Images

6.1 Press the **t** button to delete the image currently displayed in the monitor.



- **6.2** Use the multi selector ▲▼ to select the desired deletion method and press the **(B)** button.
 - To exit without deleting, press the MENU button



- **6.3** Select **Yes** and press the **®** button.
 - Deleted images cannot be recovered.
 - To cancel, select No and press the No button



Using ViewNX 2

Install ViewNX 2 to upload, view, edit, and share photos and movies.



Step 1 Installing ViewNX 2


An Internet connection is required. For system requirements and other information, see the Nikon website for your region.

- **1.1** Download the ViewNX 2 installer. Start the computer and download the installer from: http://nikonimglib.com/nvnx/
- **1.2** Double-click the downloaded file.
- **1.3** Follow the on-screen instructions.
- **1.4** Exit the installer.

 Click **Yes** (Windows) or **OK** (Mac).

Step 2 Transferring Images to the Computer

- **2.1** Choose how images will be copied to the computer. Choose one of the following methods:
 - Direct USB connection: Turn the camera off and ensure that the memory card is inserted in the camera. Connect the camera to the computer using the USB cable. The camera automatically turns on. To transfer images that are saved in the camera's internal memory, remove the memory card from the camera before connecting it to the computer.



- SD card slot: If your computer is equipped with an SD card slot, the card can be inserted directly in the slot.
- **SD card reader**: Connect a card reader (available separately from third-party suppliers) to the computer and insert the memory card.

If a message is displayed prompting you to choose a program, select Nikon Transfer 2.

When using Windows 7
 If the dialog shown at right is displayed, follow the steps below to select Nikon Transfer 2.



1 Under Import pictures and videos click

Change program. A program selection dialog will be displayed; select **Import File using Nikon Transfer 2** and click **OK**.

2 Double-click Import File.

If the memory card contains a large number of images, it may take a while for Nikon Transfer 2 to start. Wait until Nikon Transfer 2 starts.

Connecting the USB Cable

The connection may not be recognized if the camera is connected to the computer via a USB hub.

- **2.2** Transfer images to the computer.
 - Click Start Transfer



Start Transfer

 At default settings, all the images on the memory card will be copied to the computer.

2.3 Terminate the connection.

- If the camera is connected to the computer, turn the camera off and disconnect the USB cable.
- If you are using a card reader or card slot, choose the appropriate option in the computer operating system to eject the removable disk corresponding to the memory card and then remove the card from the card reader or card slot.

Step 3 Viewing Images

Start ViewNX 2.

- Images are displayed in ViewNX 2 when transfer is complete.
- Consult online help for more information on using ViewNX 2.





Other Functions

Flash Mode, Self-Timer, Macro Mode, Creative Slider, and Exposure Compensation

Use the multi selector in shooting mode to apply the following settings.



	Function	Description
1 '	\$ Flash mode	The flash modes available are ♣ AUTO (auto), ♣ (auto with red-eye reduction/red-eye reduction), ③ (off), ♣ (fill flash/standard flash), and ♣ SUW (slow sync) modes.
2 (🗴 Self-timer	The camera is equipped with 10s and 2s timers.
3 (Macro mode	Use for close-ups. The camera can focus at a closer distance when the zoom is at a position where Θ and the zoom indicator glow green.
4 🔁	Creative slider (in P , S , A , and M modes)	Use the creative slider to adjust ½ brightness (exposure compensation)*, 6 vividness, and 6 hue for taking images.
	Exposure compensation	Overall image brightness or darkness can be adjusted by setting exposure compensation before taking images.

^{*} Brightness adjustment (exposure compensation) cannot be used in **M** mode.

Selecting a Shooting Mode

When the mode dial is rotated next to the mark, the camera switches to the corresponding shooting mode shown below.



Auto mode

Used for general shooting.

SCENE Scene mode

Camera settings are optimized according to the scene that you select. When using scene auto selector, the camera automatically selects the optimum scene mode when you frame an image, making it even easier to take images using settings that suit the scene.

Smart portrait

The camera detects smiling faces and releases the shutter automatically.

EFFECTS Special effects

Effects can be applied to images during shooting.

P, S, A, M modes

Select these modes for greater control over shutter speed and aperture value.

Recording Movies

You can record movies by simply pressing the ● (*★ movie-record) button. Press the ● (*★ movie-record) button to start movie recording. Press the ● (*★ movie-record) button again to stop movie recording.



Using Camera Menus

A variety of shooting and playback settings can be adjusted from the camera menus. Press the **MENU** button to display the menu for the current mode and use the multi selector to select an item (\square 10).




Select a menu icon on the left to switch to the menu of the selected icon.

Press the **MENU** button again to exit the menu.

Using Location Data Functions/Displaying Maps

This camera receives signals from positioning satellites and obtain its current time and location data. The obtained location data (latitude and longitude) can be recorded on the images to be shot.

The current position or image shooting location can be displayed on the screen using the camera's internal map information. To display the map, press the (map) button in shooting mode or playback mode.



- To display the current position, the location data must have been obtained.
- To display the map and the image shooting location, the location data must have been recorded on playback image.



To obtain location data, press the **MENU** button, select the (location data options) menu icon (\square 24), and set **Record location data** in **Location data options** to **On**.


Should you notice smoke or an unusual smell coming from the camera or charging AC adapter, unplug the charging AC adapter and remove the battery immediately, taking care to avoid burns. Continued operation could result in injury. After removing or disconnecting the power source, take the equipment to a Nikon-authorized service representative for inspection.

♠ Do not disassemble

Touching the internal parts of the camera or charging AC adapter could result in injury. Repairs should be performed only by qualified technicians. Should the camera or charging AC adapter break open as the result of a fall or other accident, take the product to a Nikonauthorized service representative for inspection, after unplugging the product and/or removing the battery.

Do not use the camera or charging AC adapter in the presence of flammable gas

Do not use electronic equipment in the presence of flammable gas, as this could result in explosion or fire.



Never place the strap around the neck of an infant or child.

Keep out of reach of children

Particular care should be taken to prevent infants from putting the battery or other small parts into their mouths.

Do not remain in contact with the camera, charging AC adapter, or AC adapter for extended periods while the devices are on or in use

Parts of the devices become hot. Leaving the devices in direct contact with the skin for extended periods may result in low-temperature burns.

Do not leave the product where it will be exposed to extremely high temperatures, such as in an enclosed automobile or in direct sunlight

Failure to observe this precaution could cause damage or fire.

Use the appropriate power supply (battery, charging AC adapter, AC adapter, USB cable)

Using a power supply other than those provided or sold by Nikon could result in damage or malfunction.

♠ Observe caution when handling the battery

The battery may leak, overheat, or explode if improperly handled. Observe the following precautions when handling the battery for use in this product:

- Before replacing the battery, turn the product off. If you are using the charging AC adapter/AC adapter, be sure it is unplugged.
- Use only a Rechargeable Li-ion Battery EN-EL12 (included). Charge the battery by using a camera that supports battery charging. To perform this operation, use the Charging AC Adapter EH-71P (included) and USB Cable UC-E21 (included). The Battery Charger MH-65 (available separately) is also available to charge the battery without using a camera.

- When inserting the battery, do not attempt to insert it upside down or backwards.
- Do not short or disassemble the battery or attempt to remove or break the battery insulation or casing.
- Do not expose the battery to flame or to excessive heat.
- Do not immerse in or expose to water.
- Put the battery in a plastic bag, etc. to insulate the terminal before transporting it. Do not transport or store with metal objects such as necklaces or hairpins.
- The battery is prone to leakage when fully discharged. To avoid damage to the product, be sure to remove the battery when no charge remains.
- Discontinue use immediately should you notice any change in the battery, such as discoloration or deformation.
- If liquid from the damaged battery comes in contact with clothing or skin, rinse immediately with plenty of water.

⚠ Observe the following precautions when handling the charging AC adapter

- Keep dry. Failure to observe this precaution could result in fire or electric shock.
- Dust on or near the metal parts of the plug should be removed with a dry cloth. Continued use could result in fire.
- Do not handle the plug or go near the charging AC adapter during lightning storms. Failure to observe this precaution could result in electric shock.
- Do not damage, modify, forcibly tug or bend the USB cable, place it under heavy objects, or expose it to heat or flames. Should the insulation be damaged and the wires become exposed, take it to a Nikon-authorized service representative for inspection. Failure to observe these precautions could result in fire or electric shock.
- Do not handle the plug or charging AC adapter with wet hands. Failure to observe this precaution could result in electric shock.

A Handle moving parts with care

Be careful that your fingers or other objects are not pinched by the lens cover or other moving parts.

Using the flash close to your subject's eyes could cause temporary visual impairment

The flash should be no less than 1 m (3 ft 4 in.) from the subject. Particular care should be observed when photographing infants.

⚠ Do not operate the flash with the flash window touching a person or object

Failure to observe this precaution could result in burns or fire.

Turn the power off when using inside an airplane or the hospital

Turn the power off while inside the airplane during take off or landing. Before boarding an airplane, set the record location data function to OFF. End log recording. Do not use wireless network functions while in the air. Follow the instructions of the hospital when using while in a hospital. The electromagnetic waves emitted by this camera may disrupt the electronic systems of the airplane or the instruments of the hospital. If you are using an Eye-Fi card, remove it from the camera before boarding an aircraft or entering a hospital.





Caring for the Camera

To ensure continued enjoyment of this Nikon product, observe the precautions described below in addition to the warnings in "For Your Safety" (226) when using or storing the device.

Do Not Drop

The product may malfunction if subjected to strong shock or vibration.

Handle the Lens and All Moving Parts with Care

Do not apply force to the lens, lens cover, monitor, memory card slot, or battery chamber. These parts are easily damaged. Applying force to the lens cover could result in camera malfunction or damage to the lens.

Keep Dry

The device will be damaged if immersed in water or subjected to high humidity.

Avoid Sudden Changes in Temperature

Sudden changes in temperature, such as when entering or leaving a heated building on a cold day, can cause condensation to form inside the device. To prevent condensation, place the device in a carrying case or a plastic bag before exposing it to sudden changes in temperature.

Keep away from Strong Magnetic Fields

Do not use or store this device in the vicinity of equipment that generates strong electromagnetic radiation or magnetic fields. Strong static charge or the magnetic fields produced by equipment such as radio transmitters could interfere with the monitor, damage data saved on the memory card, or affect the product's internal circuitry.

Do Not Point the Lens at Strong Light Sources for Extended Periods

Avoid pointing the lens at the sun or other strong light sources for extended periods when using or storing the camera. Intense light may cause deterioration of the image sensor, producing a white blur effect in photographs.

Turn the Product off Before Removing or Disconnecting the Power Source

Do not remove the battery while the product is on, or while images are being saved or deleted. Forcibly cutting power in these circumstances could result in loss of data or in damage to product memory or internal circuitry.

Notes About the Monitor

- Monitors and electronic viewfinders are constructed with extremely high precision; at least 99.99% of pixels are effective, with no more than 0.01% being missing or defective. Hence while these displays may contain pixels that are always lit (white, red, blue, or green) or always off (black), this is not a malfunction and has no effect on images recorded with the device.
- Due to the general characteristics of OLED monitors, prolonged or repeated display of the same screen or image may result in screen burn.
 Screen burn can be recognized by decreased brightness in portions of the monitor or mottled display. In some cases, screen burn may become permanent. However, images are in no way affected by screen burn

To prevent screen burn, do not set monitor brightness higher than necessary and do not display the same screen or image for an extended period of time.

- Images in the monitor may be difficult to see under bright lighting.
- The monitor is lit by an LED backlight. Should the monitor begin to dim or flicker, contact your Nikon-authorized service representative.

Before Taking Important Pictures

Before taking pictures on important occasions (such as at weddings or before taking the camera on a trip), take a test shot to ensure that the camera is functioning normally. Nikon will not be held liable for damages or lost profits that may result from product malfunction.

Disposing of Data Storage Devices

Please note that deleting images or formatting data storage devices such as memory cards or built-in camera memory does not completely erase the original image data. Deleted files can sometimes be recovered from discarded storage devices using commercially available software, potentially resulting in the malicious use of personal image data. Ensuring the privacy of such data is the user's responsibility. Before discarding a data storage device or transferring ownership to another person, erase all data using commercial deletion software, or set **Record location data** of **Location data options** to **Off** after formatting the device and then completely refill it with images containing no private information (for example, pictures of empty sky). Be sure to also replace any pictures selected for the **Select an image** option in the **Welcome screen** setting. Care should be taken to avoid injury or damage to property when physically destroying data storage devices. For the COOLPIX S9700, the log data saved on the memory card is handled in the same way as other data. To erase the log data that is obtained but not stored on the memory card, select **Create log** → **End** log → Erase log.

You can clear the Wi-Fi settings using **Restore default settings** in the Wi-Fi options menu.

Notes About Location Data Functions (GPS/GLONASS, Electronic Compass)

Map/location name data of this camera

Before using the location data functions, make sure to read "USER LICENSE AGREEMENT FOR MAP DATA AND LOCATION NAME DATA" (\$\sum_39\$) and agree to the terms.

- The maps and location name information (Points of Interest: POI) are as of April 2013.
 - The maps and location name information will not be updated.
- The details of geological formations are displayed simplistically according to the scale of a map. The scale of a map and level of detail of the location data vary depending on country and region.
 - If the latitude becomes higher, the horizontal and vertical scales displayed on the monitor vary, therefore displayed geological formations differ from the actual formations. Use the maps and location name information only as a quide.
- The detailed map data and location name information (Points of Interest: POI) of the People's Republic of China ("China") and the Republic of Korea are not provided for the COOLPIX S9700.

Notes about record location data functions and log recording

- When Record location data in Location data options of the Location data options menu is set to On or during log recording, record location data functions and log recording function will continue to operate even after the camera is turned off.
