





First Steps

Step 1 Attach the Camera Strap and Lens Cap

Attach the lens cap to the camera strap, and then attach the strap to the camera.





Attach them at two places.





Step 2 Insert the Batteries and a Memory Card


If a memory card is inserted, images are saved on the memory card when you take images. If a memory card is not inserted, images are saved in the camera's internal memory.

2.1 Open the battery-chamber/memory card slot cover.



2.2 Insert the batteries and the memory card.





Slide the memory card in until it clicks into place.

Removing the memory card

Press the card in to partially eject the card. The card can then be removed by hand.



🖄 When Inserting Batteries or a Memory Card

- Confirm that the positive (+) and negative (-) terminals are oriented correctly.
- Inserting the memory card upside down or backwards could damage the camera and the memory card. Make sure that the memory card is correctly oriented.

Removing the Batteries and the Memory Card

- Turn the camera off and make sure that the power-on lamp and the monitor have turned off, and then open the battery-chamber/memory card slot cover.
- Hold the camera upside down to prevent the batteries from falling out.
- The camera, batteries, and memory card may be hot immediately after using the camera.


- Four LR6/L40 (AA-size) alkaline batteries
- Four FR6/L91 (AA-size) lithium batteries
- Four EN-MH2 rechargeable Ni-MH (nickel metal hydride) batteries

Performance of alkaline batteries may vary greatly depending on the manufacturer. Choose a reliable brand.






Step 3 Turn On the Camera

Remove the lens cap and press the power switch.




The Auto Off Function




- The time that elapses before the camera enters standby mode is about 30 seconds. The time can be changed using the **Auto off** setting in the setup menu.
- While the camera is in standby mode, the monitor turns back on if you perform any of the following operations:
 - → Press the power switch, shutter-release button, 🖸 (shooting mode) button,
 - ▶ (playback) button, or (▶ movie-record) button

Step 4 Select a Language and Set the Camera Clock

When the camera is turned on for the first time, the language-selection screen and the date and time setting screen for the camera clock are displayed. Use the multi selector to make the settings.

Daylight Saving Time

If daylight saving time is in effect, press to enable the daylight saving time function.

- When the daylight saving time function is enabled, 😪 is displayed above the map.
- To turn off the daylight saving time function, press $\mathbf{\nabla}$.





Set the date and time

- Select a field: Press ◀► (changes between **M**. **D**. **Y**. **h**. and **m**).
- Edit the date and time. Press AV
- Confirm the setting: Select m and press the 🕅 button.

Imprinting the Shooting Date on Printed Images

After setting the date and time, enable print date from the **Print date** option in the **Y** (setup) menu.

Display the \P (setup) menu (\square 29) using the following procedure and change the settings. Press the **MENU** button \rightarrow press the multi selector $\P \rightarrow$ press $\clubsuit \nabla$ to select the \P (setup) menu icon and press the W button \rightarrow press $\clubsuit \nabla$ to select **Print date** and press the W button.

🖉 Changing the Language Setting and the Date and Time Setting

Follow the procedure above and select Language or Time zone and date.

Step 2 Frame a Picture

2.1 Hold the camera steady.

• Keep fingers and other objects away from the lens, flash, AF-assist illuminator, microphone, and speaker.



Using the Flash

In situations where you want to use the flash, such as in dark locations or when the subject is backlit, press the \clubsuit (flash pop-up) button to raise the flash.

- When the flash is lowered, flash mode is fixed at (3) (off).
- Push the flash down gently to lower the flash until it clicks into place when not in use.









2.2 Frame the picture.

• When the camera automatically determines the scene mode, the shooting mode icon changes.





Using the Zoom

Move the zoom control.

- To zoom in closer to the subject, move toward T (telephoto).
- To zoom out and view a larger area, move toward
 W (wide-angle).


When you turn the camera on, the zoom moves to the maximum wide-angle position.





Step 3 Focus and Shoot

- **3.1** Press the shutter-release button halfway, stopping when you feel resistance.
 - When the subject is in focus, the focus area glows green (multiple focus areas can glow green).
 - When you are using digital zoom, the camera focuses on the subject in the center of the frame and the focus area is not displayed. When the camera has focused, the focus indicator glows green.
 - If the focus area or focus indicator flashes, the camera is unable to focus. Modify the composition and try pressing the shutterrelease button halfway again.



Flash lamp

The status of the flash can be confirmed by pressing the shutter-release button halfway.

* If the battery level is low, the monitor turns off while the flash is charging.



- 3.2 Without lifting your finger, press the shutter-release button the rest of the way down.
 - The shutter is released and the image is saved to the memory card or internal memory.
 - If you press the shutter-release button with too much force, the camera may shake, causing images to be blurred. Press the button gently.


Step 4 **Play Back Images**

Press the (playback) button. The camera enters playback mode.


- To display previous or subsequent images, use the multi selector $\blacktriangle \nabla \blacktriangleleft \flat$
- To return to shooting mode, press the button or shutter-release button.


Deleting Images

To delete the image currently displayed in the monitor, press the $\overleftarrow{\mathbf{m}}$ (delete) button.

When the deletion screen is displayed, use the multi selector $\blacktriangle \mathbf{V}$ to select **Current image** and press the **W** button.

When the confirmation dialog is displayed, select **Yes** and press the W button to delete the image that is displayed.

- After pressing the m button, select Erase selected images and select multiple images to be deleted. Select All images to delete all images.
- Deleted images cannot be recovered. To cancel without deleting, select No in the confirmation dialog and press the button.

ViewNX 2 is an all-in-one software package which enables you to transfer, view, edit and share images.

- **1** Start the computer and insert the ViewNX 2 CD-ROM into the CD-ROM drive.
 - Windows: If instructions for operating the CD-ROM are displayed in the window, follow the instructions to proceed to the installation window.
 - Mac: When the ViewNX 2 window is displayed, double-click the Welcome icon.
- **2** Select a language in the language selection dialog to open the installation window.
 - If the desired language is not available, click **Region Selection** to choose a different region and then choose the desired language (the **Region Selection** button is not available in the European release).
 - Click Next to display the installation window.



3 Start the installer.

- We recommend clicking **Installation Guide** in the installation window to check the installation help information and system requirements before installing ViewNX 2.
- Click Typical Installation (Recommended) in the installation window.

4 Download the software.

- When the Software Download screen is displayed, click I agree Begin download.
- Follow the on-screen instructions to install the software.
- 5 Exit the installer when the installation completion screen is displayed.
 - Windows: Click Yes.
 - Mac: Click OK.

The following software is installed:

- ViewNX 2 (consisting of the three modules below)
 - Nikon Transfer 2: For transferring images to the computer
 - ViewNX 2: For viewing, editing, and printing transferred images
 - Nikon Movie Editor: For basic editing of transferred movies
- Panorama Maker (for creating a single panorama image of a landscape, etc. from a series of images that each capture a separate portion of the subject)

6 Remove the ViewNX 2 CD-ROM from the CD-ROM drive.




Transferring Images to the Computer

1 Choose how images will be copied to the computer.

Choose one of the following methods:

• **Direct USB connection**: Turn the camera off and ensure that the memory card is inserted in the camera. Connect the camera to the computer using the USB cable. Turn the camera on.

To transfer images that are saved in the camera's internal memory, remove the memory card from the camera before connecting it to the computer.



- **SD card slot**: If your computer is equipped with an SD card slot, the card can be inserted directly in the slot.
- **SD card reader**: Connect a card reader (available separately from third-party suppliers) to the computer and insert the memory card.

If a message is displayed prompting you to choose a program, select Nikon Transfer 2.

• When using Windows 7

If the dialog shown at right is displayed, follow the steps below to select Nikon Transfer 2.

- 1 Under Import pictures and videos, click Change program. A program selection dialog will be displayed; select Import File using Nikon Transfer 2 and click OK.
- 2 Double-click Import File.

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If the memory card contains a large number of images, it may take a while for Nikon Transfer 2 to start. Wait until Nikon Transfer 2 starts.

Connecting the USB Cable

The connection may not be recognized if the camera is connected to the computer via a USB hub.

2 Transfer images to the computer.

• Click Start Transfer.



• At default settings, all the images on the memory card will be copied to the computer.



3 Terminate the connection.

 If the camera is connected to the computer, turn the camera off and disconnect the USB cable. If you are using a card reader or card slot, choose the appropriate option in the computer operating system to eject the removable disk corresponding to the memory card, and then remove the card from the card reader or card slot.







You can record movies by simply pressing the ● (* movie-record) button. Press the ● (* movie-record) button to start movie recording. Press the ● (* movie-record) button again to end recording.





Using Camera Menus

A variety of shooting and playback settings can be adjusted from the camera menus.

Press the **MENU** button to display the menu for the current mode and use the multi selector to select a menu option $(\Box 4)$.

Select one of the menu icons on the left side of the monitor to display the contents of the corresponding menu.

Press the **MENU** button again to exit the menu.





Switching Between Menus



Press the multi selector ◀. The current menu icon is displayed in yellow.



Press $\blacktriangle \nabla$ to select the desired menu icon, and press either the B button or \blacktriangleright .



The menu options become selectable.

This icon marks warnings, information that should be read before using this Nikon product, to prevent possible injury.

WARNINGS

Turn off in the event of malfunction

Should you notice smoke or an unusual smell coming from the camera or AC adapter, unplug the AC adapter and remove the batteries immediately, taking care to avoid burns. Continued operation could result in injury. After removing or disconnecting the power source, take the equipment to a Nikon-authorized service representative for inspection.

\Lambda Do not disassemble

Touching the internal parts of the camera or AC adapter could result in injury.

Repairs should be performed only by qualified technicians. Should the camera or AC adapter break open as the result of a fall or other accident, take the product to a Nikon-authorized service representative for inspection, after unplugging the product and/or removing the batteries.

▲ Do not use the camera or AC adapter in the presence of flammable gas

Do not use electronic equipment in the presence of flammable gas, as this could result in explosion or fire.



🔺 Handle the camera strap with care

Never place the strap around the neck of an infant or child.

\Lambda Keep out of reach of children

Particular care should be taken to prevent infants from putting the batteries or other small parts into their mouths.

Do not remain in contact with the camera, battery charger, or AC adapter for extended periods while the devices are on or in use

Parts of the devices become hot. Leaving the devices in direct contact with the skin for extended periods may result in lowtemperature burns.

Do not leave the product where it will be exposed to extremely high temperatures, such as in an enclosed automobile or in direct sunlight

Failure to observe this precaution could cause damage or fire.

Observe caution when handling batteries

Batteries may leak or explode if improperly handled. Observe the following precautions when handling batteries for use in this product:

- Before replacing the batteries, turn the product off. If you are using an AC adapter, be sure it is unplugged.
- Use only the batteries approved for use in this product (¹). Do not combine old and new batteries or batteries of different makes or types.
- When charging Nikon EN-MH2 rechargeable Ni-MH batteries, use only the specified charger and charge the batteries four at a time. When replacing the batteries with EN-MH2-B2 batteries (available separately), purchase two sets (total of four batteries).
- The EN-MH2 rechargeable batteries are for use with Nikon digital cameras only, and are compatible with COOLPIX L330.
- Insert batteries in the correct orientation.
- Do not short or disassemble batteries or attempt to remove or break battery insulation or casing.





- Do not expose batteries to flame or to excessive heat.
- Do not immerse in or expose to water.
- Do not transport or store with metal objects such as necklaces or hairpins.
- Batteries are prone to leakage when fully discharged. To avoid damage to the product, be sure to remove the batteries when no charge remains.
- Discontinue use immediately should you notice any change in the batteries, such as discoloration or deformation.
- If liquid from damaged batteries comes in contact with clothing or skin, rinse immediately with plenty of water.

▲ Observe the following precautions when handling the Battery Chargers (available separately)

- Keep dry. Failure to observe this precaution could result in fire or electric shock.
- Dust on or near the metal parts of the plug should be removed with a dry cloth. Continued use could result in fire.
- Do not handle the power cable or go near the battery charger during lightning storms. Failure to observe this precaution could result in electric shock.

- Do not damage, modify, forcibly tug or bend the power cable, place it under heavy objects, or expose it to heat or flame. To ensure continued enjoyment of this Nikon product, observe the precautions described below in addition to the warnings in "For Your Safety" (\square 32-35) when using or storing the device.

Do Not Drop

The product may malfunction if subjected to strong shock or vibration.

Handle the Lens and All Moving Parts with Care

Do not apply force to the lens, lens cover, monitor, memory card slot, or battery chamber. These parts are easily damaged. Applying force to the lens cover could result in camera malfunction or damage to the lens. Should the monitor break, care should be taken to avoid injury caused by broken glass and to prevent the liquid crystal from the display touching the skin or entering the eyes or mouth.

Keep Dry

The device will be damaged if immersed in water or subjected to high humidity.

Avoid Sudden Changes in Temperature

Sudden changes in temperature, such as when entering or leaving a heated building on a cold day, can cause condensation to form inside the device. To prevent condensation, place the device in a carrying case or a plastic bag before exposing it to sudden changes in temperature.
